




Pathways for 2026...

- Students MUST have completed a Certificate II in Community Health and Wellbeing as a prerequisite before enrolling into the Certificate III
- FEE FREE funding is prioritised to vocational courses (Certificate II and III)
- FEE FOR SERVICE Certificate IV in Preparation for Health and Nursing Studies - \$2400 (payment plan available)
- Once the Expression of Interest is completed using the QR codes, student's parents and schools will be contacted via email with a Letter of Offer and preference for study location.

The Certificate II in Community Health and Wellbeing is an opportunity for secondary school students to learn the foundational skill and knowledge of health and community services sector. Meaningful work experience with local organisations will form an essential part of the qualification, ensuring students can make an informed decision about their career pathway while gaining valuable handson experience in real workplaces. Upon successful completion students are able to progress on to further studies in the many ever evolving and exciting areas of health and community services.

The Certificate III Health Services Assistance builds on from the foundational skill and knowledge learnt at the certificate II level. It equips students with the expertise and knowledge needed to excel in roles focusing on patient and client care. It is the minimum qualification to work in the WA healthcare system and will open a variety of career opportunities. Upon successful completion students may go on to work as an Assistant in Nursing, Patient Care Assistant or Support Worker. It's the ideal qualification for those looking to work in a more hands-on role and continue their studies. further into nursing and related fields.

The Certificate IV in Preparation for Health and Nursing Studies is intended to provide students with the underpinning knowledge and skills in anatomy & physiology, medical terminology, health mathematics and the application of the fundamentals of physics and chemistry to nursing practice. Students will also develop an understanding of how microbiology is related to health care and the use of effective academic skills, including presentation of work. This course will help satisfy the entry requirements for the Diploma of Enrolled Nursing or to support entry into other health or nursing related qualifications at Bachelor Degree level.


